Overview: You must choose one prompt to respond to for each Tuesday meeting between Mitch and Morrie. You may choose any of the prompts for any Journal Entry; however, **you must complete each prompt one time**. Journal entries must be an <u>8 to 10 sentence</u> <u>paragraph</u> (including topic sentence and closing statement) per entry. Each entry will be graded in the following way:

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QUOTABLE QUOTES: Choose an especially important 1-3 line quotation from <u>Tuesdays with Morrie</u> and write it down in your journal. Explain how the quote is especially interesting and why it is important for others to think about.
